oreign policy of major powers is second edition and revised volume of the book. The updated edition incorporates contemporary issues and the interests and policies of major powers. The purpose of the second edition is to provide a comprehensive book which can provide a detailed historical review of foreign policy of major powers, current issues and foreign policies of major powers in twenty first century.

The book is organized in eight parts. The first part is about the foreign policy structure and formulation, processes and actors involved in the foreign policy making. In which, chapter first, second, and third deals with the foreign policy making structure of USA, Russia and China, their foreign policy objectives and historical standing. Part two includes Chapter 4 to 9 which provides a detailed historical review of Cold War and the foreign policies of major powers in the Cold War years. The part three deals with the post-Cold War era in Chapter 10 and describes the challenges that emerged in new US world order.

Part four is based on foreign policy of major powers in twenty first century. The revised edition includes the chapters by the contributing authors. Chapter 11 by Syed Saifullah Shah deals with the United States foreign policy under Obama and Trump administration. It shed light on how US is trying to maintain its dominance in the world. Chapter 13 by Nabiya Imran is about the Resurgence of Russia and how Putin is readjusting and restoring Russian position in the world.

Maryam Raashed explains the interest of major powers in the region which collides with each and increases the violence in the region. Part seven is about the nuclear politics and major power interests. Tahama Asad in chapter 19 reflects the dual policies of major powers towards nuclear proliferation and the issues that are attached with Iran and North Korea. The last part written by Mudassra Mushtaq deals with the Climate Change as non-conventional security threat which posed serious human security threat to the world and the policies adopted by major powers to mitigate it and the politics involved with climate change.
